A primary election determines which candidates will be on the ballot in the November general election, as well as deciding this year's school referendum vote.

Who can vote in Minnesota? You must be a U.S. Citizen, 18 years old on election day, and a resident of Minnesota for 20 days.

If you are not registered to vote, and wish to vote, you must bring with you a valid MN driver's license, learner's permit or ID, or a receipt for any of these, or a Tribal ID. Also bring with a current utility or phone bill listing your current address.

If you want to vote by absentee ballot, you can do so at the Clay County Courthouse. You must complete an application of an absentee ballot application prior to voting. The absentee ballot applications are available on the MN Secretary of State web site, and you can also obtain the form at City Hall.

Regular Meeting • June 13, 2016

Mayor Gene Prim called this regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Members present were Council members Jason Rick, Don Goedtke, Betty Strom, Larry Davis, Jr., Dawn Stuvland and Brad Field.

06-13-16-01 Motion Rick, second Strom to approve the agenda with the addition of the diving platform at Blue Eagle Lake. Motion carried.

06-13-16-02 Motion Davis, second Goedtke to approve the consent agenda as presented. Council member Rick asked staff to include current draft minutes of the Planning Commission in the agenda packets. Motion carried.

06-13-16-03 Motion Strom, second by Mr. Rick to deny the CUP request in entirety. Strom stated that this CUP has two separate questions, and would like to see a separate CUP request for each item. Strom next stated she would like to revise her motion, second Rick to deny the CUP request for the 7-foot composite fence for 75 feet along the North edge of property, and approve the wrought iron fence around the gazebo at Friendship Park. After much discussion, Mayor Prim called for the vote on the motion. Voting aye: Strom, Rick and Goedtke. Voted nay: Davis, Stuvland, and Field. Mayor Prim stated that due to a tie in the motion, that he would need to vote to break the tie, and Mayor Prim voted nay. Motion denied.

06-13-16-04 Motion Field, second Davis to accept the CUP for Friendship Park with the conditions set forth in the CUP. Voted aye: Davis, Stuvland, and Field. Voted nay: Strom, Goedtke, and Rick. Mayor Prim voted aye. Motion carried.

06-13-16-05 Motion Rick, second Stuvland to direct staff to proceed with rezoning of all City parks to the P-Public Facilities District. Motion carried.

06-13-16-06 Motion Rick, second Strom to extend the CUP for Nicholas Aadland and Benson Kimemia to October 15, 2016 to complete the conditions set forth in the CUP. Motion carried.

06-13-16-07 Motion Field, second Goedtke to approve the Delzer

bid in the amount of \$20,910.00 for the Splash Pad project. Carried. 06-13-16-08 Motion Rick, second Stuvland to approve the proposal from Aquatic Recreation Company for the construction of a splash pad in McGrath Park in the amount of \$112,522.00. Motion carried.

06-13-16-09 Motion Davis, second Goedtke to approve the TAP Grant Trail Project resolution. Voted aye: Rick, Goedtke, Strom, Davis, Stuvland and Field. Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

06-13-16-10 Motion Rick, second Stuvland to approve a resolution authorizing or reauthorizing membership in the 4M Fund. Voted aye: Rick, Goedtke, Strom, Davis, Stuvland and Field. Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

06-13-16-11 Motion Davis, second Goedtke to approve the Change Order #1 for the Del Acres Gilbertson 2nd Addition in the amount of \$11,342.00. Motion carried.

06-13-16-12 Motion Davis, second Goedtke to limit the amount of garbage per resident to 10 cubic yards during Clean Up Week. Motion carried.

06-13-16-13 Motion Rick, second Goedtke to approve a resolution eliminating of parcels from Tax Increment Financing District No. 1-1 within Redevelopment Project No. 1. Voted aye: Rick, Goedtke, Strom, Davis, Stuvland, and Field. Voted nay: None. Carried.

06-13-16-14 Motion Davis, second Stuvland to approve the resolution authorizing an amendment to the operation and maintenance agreement with People Service. Voted aye: Rick, Goedtke, Strom, Davis, Stuvland, and Field. Voted nay: None. Motion carried.

06-13-16-15 Motion Rick, second Davis to approve the bid from Blue Sky Daylighting in the amount of \$93,250.00 for the Del Acres-Gilbertson 2nd Addition for the installation of electrical distribution and conduit for the fiber distribution. Motion carried.

06-13-16-16 Motion Strom and second by Mrs. Stuvland to approve a resolution declaring Potato Days a community-wide festival. Voted aye: Rick, Goedtke, Strom, Davis, Stuvland and Field. Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

06-13-16-17 Motion Strom, second Field to authorize staff to remove the diving platform at Blue Eagle Lake. Voted aye: Rick, Strom, Stuvland and Field. Voted nay: Davis and Goedtke. Carried. Mayor Prim adjourned the meeting at 9:04 p.m.

Calls can be made to anywhere in the world (long distance charges apply), 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. All calls are completely confidential.

TELEPHONE EQUIPMENT DISTRIBUTION (TED) PROGRAM

The TED Program provides free specialized telecommunications equipment to income eligible Minnesotans who are having trouble using the telephone due to a hearing, speech or physical disability.

To make a relay call dial 7-1-1. Once connected to the relay service, tell the CA the type of relay call you wish to make. Or, you may dial the specific toll-free number for the type of relay service.

Captioned Telephone Service (CTS)

CTS uses a telephone with a text display screen to allow a person who is hard of hearing to see word-for-word captions of what the other party on the call is saying, while also listening to what is being said using their residual hearing - much like TV captioning. The CTS user speaks directly to the other person on the call, and the CA, who uses speech recognition technology, repeats what the other party says, which is then transmitted as text to the CTS user's phone.

Internet Protocol Captioned Telephone Service (IP CTS)

Computer (ASCII): 1-800-627-3529

Computer users can access Minnesota Relay. Set your communications software to the following protocols: speeds ranging from 300 to 2400; 8 Bits; No Parity; 1 Stop Bit; Full Duplex. When calling at a rate of 300 or below, follow the above using Half Duplex.

Hearing Carry Over (HCO): 1-800-627-3529

HCO allows a person who can hear clearly but who has very limited or no speech capability to make and receive phone calls. The HCO user types his or her conversation on a text telephone for the CA to read to the other person, and listens directly to the other person's response.

Internet Protocol (IP) Relay:

IP Relay combines text-based relay service with the ease of the Internet - no need for a TTY. It allows relay users to communicate by text via a computer or other Internet-enabled device. Go to: www.sprintrelay.com.

Spanish Relay: 1-877-627-5448

Spanish speaking persons with a hearing or speech disability are able to make relay calls. This is not a translation service - both parties must speak Spanish, and at least one party must have a hearing or speech disability.

Speech-to-Speech (STS): 1-877-627-3848

STS allows a person who has difficulty speaking or being understood on the phone to communicate using his or her own voice or voice synthesizer. The CA revoices the words of the person with the speech disability so that the other person on the call can understand them.

Standard Telephone: 1-800-627-3529

A hearing person may use a standard telephone or mobile phone to place a relay call and converse with a person who is deaf, hard of hearing, or speech disabled.

Text-to-Voice (TTY): 1-800-627-3529

This service allows a person who is deaf, hard of hearing, or speech disabled to use a TTY to communicate with the other person on the call.

Video Relay Service (VRS)

VRS allows a person who uses American Sign Language (ASL) to communicate over the phone. The VRS user connects to the CA via an Internet-enabled device with a video camera. The CA relays the conversation back and forth between the parties - in ASL with the VRS user and by voice with the called party. Go to: www.fcc.gov/guides/video-relay-services.

Voice Carry Over (VCO): 1-877-627-3024

VCO allows a person with a hearing disability, but who wants to use his or her own voice, to speak directly to the other party. The CA then types the other party's response, which is displayed on the VCO user's text telephone.

900 Pay-Per-Call Services: 1-900-230-3324

This service allows a relay user to connect to any pay-per-call service.
