
COUNCIL FILINGS CLOSE AUGUST 15

Mayor Prim called this regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Members present were Council members Don Goedtke. Betty Strom, Larry Davis, Jr., David Brown, and Brad Field. Absent was council member Jason Rick

06-12-17-01 Motion Goedtke, second Strom to approve the agenda as presented, with the addition of the CUP status at 508 6th Street NW. Motion carried.

06-12-17-02 Motion Davis, second Strom to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried

06-12-17-03 Motion Goedtke, second Davis to approve the sewer repair on 5th Street SE. Council member Field stated he would like the city to obtain a contractor as soon as possible for this repair. Motion carried.

06-12-17-04 Motion Davis, second Goedtke to approve the purchase of a raft for Blue Eagle Lake, not to exceed \$3,000. Voted ave: Davis, Brown, and Goedtke. Voted nay: Strom and Field. Motion carried.

06-12-17-05 Motion Field, second Strom to approve the petition for improvements at 105 3rd Street SE and 203 2nd Ave. SE. Motion carried.

06-12-17-06 Motion Field, second Davis to approve the Preliminary and Final Plat for the Barnesville Commercial Park 3rd Addition. Motion carried.

06-12-17-07 Motion Goedtke, second Brown to approve the 1st reading of Ordinance 2017-05, regarding garage space requirements. Motion carried.

06-12-17-08 Motion Field, second Davis to approve to hire a full-time police officer. Motion carried.

06-12-17-09 Motion Field, second Davis to change the employment status of Police Officer Jeff Tharldson from full-time to parttime, and pay out any benefits due to him. Motion carried.

06-12-17-10 Motion Davis, second Strom to approve the MAV TV Renewal. Motion carried.

06-12-17-11 Motion Strom, second Goedkte to approve the resolution declaring Potato Days a Community Wide Festival. Voted aye: Goedtke, Strom, Davis, Brown and Field. Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

Mayor Prim Adjourned the meeting at 8:10 p.m.


BARNESVILLE CITY COUNCIL Special Meeting • June 20, 2017

Mayor Prim called this special meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Members present were Council members Jason Rick, Don Goedtke, David Brown, and Brad Field. Absent was Council member Davis and Strom.

Mayor Prim stated the first item on the agenda was the additional financing for development costs in the Del Acres Gilbertson 2nd Addition.Council member Strom arrived at 6:31 p.m.

06-20-17-01 Motion Field, second Rick to approve the following resolution, approving an additional \$100,000.00 interfund loan to the EDA for the continued development of the DelAcres Gilbertson 2nd Addition, and the actual amounts dispersed as needed. Council member Brown questioned if drain tile ever gets plugged. TEC Manager Guy Swenson expressed his concerns about the location and vaults, that the trenching is close to the infrastructure. The trenching needs to be packed properly. EDA Director Karen Lauer stated that the contractors will meet all OSHA requirements. Voted ave: Rick, Goedtke, Strom, Brown and Field, Absent: Davis, Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

Mayor Prim adjourned the meeting at 6:55 p.m.
