


FALL LEAF PICK-UP SCHEDULED

With summer behind us, it won't be long and the leaves will be falling from the trees! Fuchs Sanitation, in cooperation with the City has scheduled two special leaf pick-ups.

The first on **Friday**, **October 20th** and the second on **Friday**, **October 27th**.

Leaves should be placed in clear garbage bags at the normal pick-up sites.

Residents may also dispose of their leaves at the compost pile at the Burn Site located near the Public Works shop.

08-14-17-01 Motion Rick, second Goedtke to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

08-14-17-02 Motion Rick, second Strom to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried.

08-14-17-03 Motion Strom, second Rick to approve the Park Improvements Plan, and authorize allocation of up to \$130,000.00, contingent on successful fundraising to bring in the remaining \$137,000.00 to fund the plan as recommended by the Personnel & Finance Committee. Motion carried.

08-10-17-01 Motion Davis, second Rick to go into closed session for the purpose of discussing potential litigation regarding sanitary sewer connections in the Del Acres Gilbertson 2nd Addition and to discuss potential settlement negotiations with the MPCA. Carried.

GET YOUR E-MAIL WHEN YOU'RE GONE !

Residents who use the City of Barnesville for their internet service are reminded that it's easy to get your e-mails when you're out of town or gone for the winter!

All Barnesville Internet customers have FREE access to Webmail services, available anywhere that you have internet access, simply by going to **www.bvillemn.net** and click on Webmail Access on the left side. You will need to enter your entire e-mail address and e-mail password, then you can read, write and respond to all your e-mails. Forgotten your password or just need help? Residents that go south for the winter are reminded that to utilize Webmail, you will need to put your phone service on winter hold, which is a \$10 per month charge; and also your internet service on winter hold, which is \$5 per month

charge. For more info call City Hall at 354-2292.

SEASONAL SUMP PUMP WAIVER

Barnesville residents are reminded that sump pump drain discharge into the sanitary sewer is prohibited from April 1 to October 31.

ONLY IF property owners apply for a waiver through City Hall are they allowed to discharge sump pumps into the sanitary sewer from November 1 to March 31.

Under the waiver requirements, the property owner agrees to pay an annual waiver fee of \$ 50 as established by Resolution of the City Council, which will be billed at \$4.17 per month. This allows the discharge to go into the sanitary sewer during the winter months.

Per City Ordinance, on April 1, the sump pump must once again be discharged outside.

Residents are reminded that per Barnesville City Code, non-compliance with the Sump Pump Ordinance is subject to a \$100 month penalty.

Care should be taken so the discharge doesn't cause icing problems on sidewalks or streets.For more info or **to apply for a waiver**, **call or stop by City Hall during business hours.**
