

Prepare Your Waste Properly for Disposal

Protect Yourself

- Wear protective clothing.
- Do not smoke.
- Do not wear contact lenses if handling solvents.
- Work in well-ventilated area.
- Avoid breathing fumes.
- Keep children and pets away.
- Do not expose yourself to toxic chemicals if pregnant.

Bring Materials in Original Containers

- If original container is not available, clearly mark on your container its present contents.
- Do not mix different waste products in the same container.

Pack Carefully

- Place containers in a cardboard box lined with plastic. Do not place product in a plastic bag only.
- Pack them in upright position.
- Tighten all lids before transporting.
- If container is leaking, pack in larger leak free container.

Transport

- Place boxes inside car trunk or pickup box.
- If inside vehicle, keep vehicle ventilated.
- Place combustibles out of direct sunlight and away from heat sources.
