A portion of Highway 9 within Barnesville city limits is scheduled to be reconstructed in 2023. PartnerSHIP 4 Health and SRF Consulting Group are working with the City of Barnesville on a community input process to create a concept plan for Highway 9 which will look at how this section of roadway can be improved for biking, walking, and handicapped-accessibility. The plan will also consider features like lighting, street furniture, landscaping and public art.

PartnerSHIP 4 Health will also be helping Barnesville create a multi-use path (biking and walking trail) plan for the City!!

For the first part of the meeting, consultants from SRF will facilitate a group discussion about general issues of biking, walking, and handicapped-accessibility in Barnesville; followed by a public input exercise to gather ideas on future multi-use path connections within Barnesville, as well as possible connections between Barnesville and neighboring communities.

The second part of the meeting will be focused on the Highway 9 project.

FASTER INTERNET SPEEDS AND NEW OPPORTUNITIES TO SAVE!

Effective this month residents will notice a couple of changes. With the exception of businesses who have 1 GIG internet service, all customers will see a 5 MB increase in both the upload and download speeds at no addition charge! When you read this the increase will have been made.

On the enclosed utility bill, Cable TV customers will see a slight increase due to the increased cost of retransmitting the local FM channels. Economy basic will increase to \$25.95 and the Preferred package will increase to \$84.95.

To help offset this increased cost, the City has made a change to the combo discount. Combo discounts are available to customers who purchase internet, Cable TV and Barnesville Long Distance through the City of Barnesville.

Now, if you have the Preferred Cable along with internet and Barnesville Long Distance, your combo discount will increase by \$5 per month! This change is automatic, so you do not need to call us to receive the increased discount.
