SEC. 8-0101. CITATION. The following fees, rates and charges shall apply under City Code, Chapter 1-09, Sections 1-0903 through 1-0904, as follows:

## SEC. 2-0106. RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL. (Source: Ord. 2015-03; Ord. 2017-02)

Fees payable by those receiving the garbage collection service shall be payable on a monthly basis, and are hereby established as follows:
$\$ 17.22$ monthly per residential customer. This fee will increase by 2.5\% on February 1, 2018, and every year thereafter until February 1, 2022, when this increase shall be reconsidered by the Council.
$\$ 15.97$ monthly per residential customer 65 years of age and older. This fee will increase by $2.5 \%$ on February 1, 2018, and every year thereafter until February 1, 2022, when this increase shall be reconsidered by the Council.

SEC. 2-0107. RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO WATER SERVICE.
Water Rate:
A. Water shall be charged monthly to each customer at $\$ 12.20$ for a standard 5/8 inch meter connection.

Example: For a four (4) inch meter connection, the computation would be:
$\frac{.625}{12.20}=\frac{4.0}{X}$

B. In addition to the foregoing flat rate, water usage shall be charged at $\$ 1.25$ per 1,000 gallons.
SEC. 2-0108. RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO SEWERAGE USE.
Subd. 4 - Private Wastewater Disposal. Fees set by consolidated ordinance.
SEC. 2-0109. SEWER SERVICE CHARGES.
A. Residential Flat Rate Charge: For each single family dwelling there shall be a flat rate of $\$ 9.75$ per month for each connection. The flat rate charge shall be increased by $\$ .75$ on January 1 annually for five consecutive years.
B. Commercial/Industrial Flat Rate Charge: For each commercial/industrial connection there shall be a flat rate charge of \$18.75. The flat rate charge shall be increased by $\$ .75$ on January 1 annually for five consecutive years.
C. Residential Volume Charge: In addition to the flat rate charge in Subparagraph A, above, there shall be a volume charge for residential usage. This charge shall be determined by taking the average amount of water used by the customer in the months of January and February each year and that average volume multiplied by $\$ 1.00$ per thousand gallons or fraction thereof shall be billed on a monthly basis.
D. Commercial/Industrial Volume Charge: In addition to the flat rate charge in Subparagraph B, above, there shall be a volume charge for commercial/industrial usage. This charge shall be determined by the actual amount of water used by the customer each month and that volume multiplied by $\$ 1.00$ per thousand gallons or fraction thereof shall be billed on a monthly basis.
E. Large Commercial/Industrial Users: Large commercial/industrial users of the waste water system whose use and discharge qualities and/or quantities are not parallel to general waste discharges will be assessed accordingly on a case-by-case basis as established by vote of the Council.

SEC. 2-0113. ESTABLISHMENT OF CERTAIN TELEPHONE, CABLE TV, DSL AND HIGH SPEED INTERNET SERVICE RATES, MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS, AND ADOPTION OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS TARIFFS. (Source: Ord. 2014-05; Ord. 2016-04)

Cable TV rates are set and adjusted by resolution of the City Council.
B. Internet

Section 1. Costs for High Speed Internet service:
High Speed Internet rates will be set and adjusted by resolution of the City Council.

Section 2. Transfers to General Fund
A. Operating Transfer Calculation.

1. The operating transfer amount to the City of Barnesville’s General Fund is determined annually during the budget process to meet the financial goals of the Broadband and Internet fund and provide a reasonable transfer to the General Fund to meet its revenue resource requirements. The transfer amount is calculated by multiplying the number of active DSL connections reported to the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) in December from the previous budget year by the transfer rate of $\$ 157.75$ per active DSL connection. (Example; 2015 transfers would be based on the number of active DSL Connections reported to NECA in December 2013)
2. Additional transfers may be authorized by the City Council provided that an unplanned, or emergency, expenditure out of the general fund budget occurs and it is necessary to fund said expenditure out of additional transfers from the utility provided that a majority vote of the City Council is required to authorize an additional transfer.
