We all want to help protect the environment. The good news is that 62 percent of the energy that you purchased from Barnesville Municipal Power last year came from renewable resources, including wind, solar, and the hydroelectric power plants along the Missouri River. But many people want to do more. That's why we are now offering **Bright Energy Choices!**

By enrolling in **Bright Energy Choices**, you can purchase Renewable Energy Certificates or REC's to offset the non-renewable portion of your energy consumption, making your usage, in effect, 100% renewable.

A small premium of **\$.005 (one-half cent)** per kilowatt-hour of energy will be added to 38% of your kilowatt-hour usage each month. This represents the non-renewable portion of the energy you use, which will be offset by REC's when you participate.

For an average homeowner who would use 500 kilowatt-hours per month, the **Bright Energy Choices** premium will be only \$2.50 per month.

Regular Meeting • February 10, 2020

Mayor Rick called this regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Members present were Council members Scott Bauer, Dawn Stuvland, Don Goedtke, Tonya Stokka, Alyssa Bergman, and Brad Field.

- 02-10-20-01 Motion Goedtke, second Stokka to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.
- 02-10-20-02 Motion Stuvland, second Bergman to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried.
- 02-10-20-03 Motion Field, second Goedtke to open the public hearing at 7:05 p.m. for the Barnesville School District. Carried.
- 02-10-20-04 Motion Field, second Bauer to close the public hearing at 7:07 p.m. Motion carried.
- 02-10-20-05 Motion Bauer, second Stokka to approve the resolution vacating a portion of right-of-way along the north edge of the 5th Ave. SE right-of-way 42.04 ft. in width for a distance of 300.09 ft. East for the intersection with the right-of-way for 5th Street SE. Voted aye: Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Bergman, and Field. Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

- 02-10-20-18 Motion by Stokka, second Stuvland to set Thursday, March 5th at 7:00 p.m. for the informational meeting on 13th Street trail. Motion carried.
- 02-10-20-19 Motion Field, second Bergman to approve and authorize TEC Manager Guy Swenson to execute the FOX Corporation Affiliation Agreement. Motion carried.
- 02-10-20-20 Motion Field, second Bergman to approve and

authorize the purchase of 126 3 phase AMI enabled electric meters, not to exceed \$41,791.61 from Cannon Technologies, Inc. Motion carried.

- 02-10-20-21 Motion Field, second Stokka to approve and authorize the purchase of the S595 T4 Bobcat in the amount of \$38,777.90 plus taxes from Bobcat Company. Motion carried.
- 02-10-20-22 Motion Stokka, second Goedtke to approve the 2 bids from Arvig. Bid 1-Electric in the amount of \$19,016.60 and Bid 2-move 144 fiber trunk line in the amount of \$28,614.92. With the total of both bids not to exceed \$47,631.52. Motion carried.
