Regular Meeting • May 11, 2020**

Mayor Rick called this regular meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. Members present were Council members Scott Bauer, Dawn Stuvland, Don Goedtke, Tonya Stokka, Alyssa Bergman, and Brad Field.

05-11-20-01 Motion Goedtke, second Stokka to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

05-11-20-02 Motion Goedtke, second Bergman to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried.

05-11-20-03 Motion Field, second Stuvland to accept the 2019 audit report from CliftonLarsonAllen. Motion carried.

05-11-20-04 Motion by Mrs. Stokka and second by Mr. Goedtke to approve the Resolution Providing for the Sale of \$2,560,000 General Obligation Improvement Bonds, Series 2020B. Voted aye: Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Bergman, and Field. Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

05-11-20-05 Motion Field, second Stokka to approve the Preliminary and Final Plat for the Barnesville School District, all of the contingencies in the motion that was approved on July 30, 2018, vacating a section of 4th Street SE have been satisfied. Motion carried.

05-11-20-06 Motion Field, second Stokka to approve the CUP for the Barnesville EDA for the Planned Unit Development for the property described as the Barnesville Commercial Park 4th Addition, with the conditions set forth in the CUP. Motion carried.

05-11-20-07 Motion Bauer, second Stokka to approve the 2nd reading of Ordinance 2020-09, an Ordinance to amend the Official Zoning Map. Motion carried.

05-11-20-08 Motion Goedtke, second Stokka to approve the Summary Ordinance 2020-09. Motion carried.

05-11-20-09 Motion Field, second Bergman to award the contract for the Sewer Lagoon project to Sellin Brothers and approve Change Order #1. Voted aye: Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Berman and Field. Voted nay: none. Motion carried.

05-11-20-10 Motion Goedtke, second Bergman to approve the Change Order #2 for the Bike Trail Project. Motion carried.

05-11-20-11 Motion Goedtke, second Stokka to approve the expenses for the 13th Street project at an estimated total cost of \$45,362.00, as presented. Council member Bauer questioned if there was any Class 5 in this price. Public Works Supt. Don Williams stated that the project will start the second week of June. Motion carried.

05-11-20-12 Motion Goedtke, second Stokka to approve the replacement of the Golf Course bridge, not to exceed \$35,000.00. Motion carried.

05-11-20-13 Motion Bergman, second Bauer to authorize staff to reallocate \$50,000 from the Revolving Loan Fund to the EDA Emergency Loan Fund. Motion carried.

05-11-20-14 Motion Bauer, second Stuvland to approve the

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Resolution approving the Elimination of Parcels From TIF Dist. No. 1-1. Voted aye: Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Bergman and Field. Voted against: none. Motion carried.

05-11-20-15 Motion by Mr. Bauer and second by Mrs. Stuvland to extend our "Keep America Connected" pledge to June 30, 2020. Motion carried.

Mayor Rick adjourned the meeting at 8:56 p.m.

**BARNESVILLE CITY COUNCIL
Emergency Meeting • May 28, 2020**

Minn. Stat. § 13D.021, subd. 1(4)

Mayor Rick called this emergency council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Members present were Council members Scott Bauer, Dawn Stuvland, Don Goedtke, Tonya Stokka, Alyssa Bergman, and Brad Field. Others in attendance were City Administrator Mike Rietz, City Attorney John Shockley, EDA Director Karen Lauer, Main Street Director Bailey Thompson, Eric Newell, Dayna Hoppe, Adam Hutton and Michael Stein with Record Review.

Mayor Rick stated the only item on the agenda was to discuss temporary outdoor service for restaurants and bars related to COVID-19.

City Attorney Shockley explained that with Governor Walz' Executive Order allowing Bars and Restaurants to re-open with outdoor seating, some additional approvals are needed from local units of government to allow businesses to take full advantage of the opportunity. He is recommending adoption of a Temporary Use Agreement document to allow businesses to use public property to provide service outdoors and to adjust their liquor license to allow service of alcohol outside their buildings. He also recommends granting the City Administrator the authority to approve these Temporary Use Agreements.

05-28-20-01 Motion by Mr. Bauer and second by Mrs. Stokka to approve the use of a Temporary Use Agreement to enable bars and restaurants to serve outdoors until Dec. 31, 2020 and that the City Administrator has the authority to approve these agreements. Upon a roll call vote, the following voted aye: Council members Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Bergman, and Field. Those voted nay: none. Motion carried.

Mayor Rick adjourned the meeting at 7:33 p.m.
