Barnesville City Hall and Firehall Liquors will be CLOSED on **Monday**, **Sept. 7** for the Labor Day.


#### PREFERRED CABLE RATES CHANGE

### **COUNCIL DISCUSSES PRIORITIES**

Prior to the July 13 City Council Meeting, Mayor Jason Rick asked all the City Council members to share what they felft should be priorities for the upcoming year.

Suggested items included: address childcare shortage, upkeep and cleaning of Blue Eagle Lake, more rental housing, water & sewer infrastructure improvements, Community Center, secure funds to connect the bike paths, more Assisted living, more focus on downtown businesses, development of the Ernst property, development of twinhomes, encourage shopping local, more Handicap parking downtown, support of existing businesses, next steps for Cable TV, new liquor store, Tenant for 2nd Floor of Old City Hall, 2023 Front Street project, continued focus on residential lot sales, electric system voltage conversion, pedestrian signal at Highway 9 and Highway 34 corner, Water Tower Capacity, attract new hotel to town and clean-up salvage yard
