Regular City Council Meetings are held the second Monday of every month beginning at 7:00 pm in the City Council Chambers located at the rear of City Hall. The public are welcome. The agenda is posted on the City's website and Facebook page.

Mayor Rick called this regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Member's present were Council members Tonya Stokka, Alyssa Bergman, Brad Field, Dawn Stuvland, Scott Bauer, and Don Goedtke

05-09-22-01 Motion Stuvland, second Stokka to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

05-09-22-02 Motion Stokka, second Stuvland to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried

05-09-22-03 Motion Goedtke, second Bergman to approve the Potato Days Resolution. Voted aye: Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Bergman and Field. Motion carried.

05-09-22-04 Motion Field, second Goedtke to approve the resolution for Local Government Aid. Voted aye: Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Bergman and Field. Motion carried.

05-09-22-05 Motion Goedtke, second Stokka to approve the resolution approving the elimination of parcels from TIF District No. 1-1. Voted aye: Stokka, Goedtke, Stuvland, Bauer, Bergman and Field. Motion carried.

05-09-22-06 Motion Field, second Stokka to approve the petition for improvements at 202 7th Street SE, with an interest rate of 4.5%. Motion carried.

05-09-22-07 Motion Stokka, second Bergman to change the city election from odd years, to even years. Motion carried.

05-09-22-08 Motion Stokka, second Goedtke to have the change of election years, from odd years to even years, to be placed on the November 8, 2022 ballot for the voters to vote on. Motion carried. 05-09-22-09 Motion Stuvland, second Stokka to close the regular session of the city council at 7:46 p.m. Motion carried.

Council performed City Administrator's 6-month review. Left closed session at 8:48 p.m. and returned to regular session 05-09-2022-01 Motion Field, second Goedtke to extend the City Administrator's probationary period for an additional 6 months, with no raise. Motion approved.

Regular meeting was Adjourned at 9:02 p.m.

Potential for Rolling Blackouts this Summer!



Missouri River Energy Services, the city's power provider, has advised Barnesville Municipal Power that projections show possible energy shortages during the summer of 2022. Barnesville is part of a larger region encompassing the central US.

Based on energy demand, rolling blackouts may be needed. Barnesville Municipal Power will be asked to reduce their energy use and residents and businesses may be asked to voluntarily curtail their electric load when needed.

Summer Watering Ordinance

Barnesville residents are reminded that water restrictions are in effect from June 1st to September 1st. During these months, no lawns shall be watered or cars washed between 10 am and 7 pm. The ordinance is designed to conserve our valuable water resources and to help the City's water plant operate at its best.

Starting on June 1st, if your address ends in an odd number, you may water your lawn or wash cars on **odd-numbered days** (the 1st, 3rd, 5th days of the month, etc.) **from 7 pm to 10 am.** If the last digit of your address is an even number, you can water or wash cars on **even-numbered days** (2nd, 4th, 6th, etc.) **from 7 pm to 10 am**.

If you have a newly seeded or sodded lawn, it may be watered daily between 7 pm and 10 a.m. for up to six weeks after the sod is installed or the seeds have germinated. Gardens, flowers, trees, and shrubs may be watered with the use of a garden hose with an adjustable nozzle without restriction.

Violators may be subject to a \$25 fine for each day of violation. Copies of the full Water Ordinance are available at City Hall offices.
