Special Meeting

July 20, 2023

Mayor Rick called this special meeting to order at 7:30 a.m. Member's present were Council members Tonya Stokka, Scott Bauer, Alyssa Bergman and Brad Field. Absent were council members Don Goedtke and Dawn Stuvland. Others in attendance were City Administrator Jeremy Cossette, City Clerk Jeri Reep and Ley Bouchard with the Record Review.

Mayor Rick stated the first item on the agenda was the second reading of Ordinance 2023-08, an Ordinance regarding the use of cannabis in public.

City Administrator Jeremy Cossette stated that the only change to this ordinance from the first reading was adding the fine amounts. The Ordinance committee met, and recommend the fine amounts listed in the ordinance.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2023-08

CITY OF BARNESVILLE, MINNESOTA

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BARNESVILLE CITY CODE

The Council of the City of Barnesville, Minnesota does ordain:

Title VI, Chapter 6-12, Section 6-1201 of the Barnesville City Code is hereby adopted to read as follows:

Chapter 6-12 Cannabis

Section 6-1201 Use of Cannabis in Public.

Subd. 1 It is unlawful to use cannabis flower, cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles and hemp-derived consumer products, as defined in Minn. Stat. Section 342.01, in public places anywhere in the City.

Subd. 2 As used in this Section, public places include all areas contained within the City boundaries, except the following:

A. Private residences, including the curtilage and yard; and

B. Private property not generally accessible by the public, unless a person is explicitly prohibited from consuming cannabis flower,

cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles or hemp-derived consumer products on the property by the owner of the property; and

C. The premises of an establishment or event licensed to permit on-site consumption of cannabis flower, cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles or hemp-derived consumer products.

Subd. 3 Violation of this Section is a petty misdemeanor as defined by Minnesota law. This Section may be enforced by the City of Barnesville Administrative Citations and Civil Penalties, City Code Section 1-0319.

This ordinance is adopted by affirmative vote of four of the six (6) Ward Representatives of the City Council, constituting a majority of the Ward Representatives.

Mayor Rick stated the next item on the agenda was the approval of the Change Order for the Highway 9 project.

City Administrator Jeremy Cossette informed council members that this change order is to supply and install the bond breaker on both sides of the walk where aesthetics is present. The approximate cost is \$2,004 increase. This will help alleviate cracking while the joints of the sidewalk and the joints of the aesthetic piece will not align.
