2024 Utility Rate Changes

Each year Barnesville residents see a few small changes to utility rates. These increases help cover the cost of the new water tower and lagoons.

On the bill you receive the end of January:

- Sewer volume charges increase to \$6.42
- · Water usage charge increase to \$3.51
- Water, Sewer, Stormwater replacement funds each increase to \$3.51 month.

Open curtains on your south-facing windows during the day to allow sunlight to naturally heat your home, and close them at night to reduce the chill you may feel from cold windows.



LOWER YOUR HOLIDAY LIGHTING COSTS

Use LED holiday light strings to reduce the cost of decorating your home for the , winter holidays



COVER DRAFTY WINDOWS

Use a heavy-duty plastic sheet or clear plastic film on the inside of your window frames during the cold winter months Make sure the plastic is sealed tightly to the frame to help reduce infiltration.




ADJUST THE TEMPERATURE

When you're home & awake set your thermostat as low as is comfortable. When you are asleep or out of the house, turn your thermostat back 10° to 15° for sight hours and results. for eight hours and save around 10% a year on your heating and cooling bills.



REDUCE HEAT LOSS FROM THE

Keep your fireplace damper closed unless a fire is burning. Keeping the damper open is like keeping a window wide open during the winter; it allows warm air to go right up the chimney. If you never use your fireplace, plug and seal the chimney flue.



Seal the air leaks around utility cut-throughs for pipes, gaps around chimneys and recessed lights in insulated ceilings, and unfinished spaces behind cupboards and closets. Add caulk or weatherstripping to seal air leaks around leaky doors and
